Growing a Healthy Church

Summary of First Message

A healthy, growing church is not primarily marked by proper church order (although that has its place)

Nor even because the glorious Lord is in the midst, (because He is always glorious in every church)

But it is marked by saints who are filled with all the fullness of God!

Therefore, Christ is both the "fulness" and the "filler of hearts"







Identification truths about the new man

Crucified with Christ Gal. 2:20

Buried with Him Rom. 6:4

Risen with Him Col. 3:1

Seated with Him Eph. 2:6

Eph. 2:14 - 15

"one new man" = the church

(also described as "body," "building," "lampstand" etc.

One special term is the "bride")

Emphasis of this term: Love, submission, vulnerability

Dangers to the Bride - II Cor. 11:2

- 1) Can we apply the term "bride of Christ" to the local church?
- 2) Is the term "bride" fitting for the church at Corinth?
- 3) How then does Christ view and address His bride?

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The Lord addressing His church

I Cor. 1:2 sanctified in Christ Jesus; called saints

Eph. 1 saints; faithful in Christ Jesus

Col. 1 saints; faithful brethren

I Thes. 1 in God the Father and in the Lord Jesus Christ

5 all the holy brethren

James my brethren

I Pet. 1 elect according to the foreknowledge of God

II Pet. 1 obtained like precious faith with us

I John little children

Jude sanctified by God the Father, preserved in Christ Jesus and called

Rev. the Spirit and the bride say, Come

Two Observations

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The Lord never addresses the child of God as a mixture of old and new natures. He addresses him as a saint (holy one),

And He never addresses His bride as a mixed multitude! He addresses her as "the saints." (pure & spotless bride).
